



Grape Varieties

Table Grapes

Succulent, tear-shaped or round berries growing in clusters on woody, deciduous climbing vines.

Ranging in color from green and yellow to red, purple, and blue-black, there are multiple varieties of table grapes to choose from depending on when they ripen and the flavor that is desired.

The lists below represent what was ordered or grown for 2026. If you'd like to check on current availability of a particular variety, please check with a store associate.

| Variety | Description |
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| Concord | Blue seedless grape which ripens late in the season, often late September. Originally developed in Concord, Massachusetts and introduced in 1843. Vigorous, very productive vines produce medium to large size clusters of fruit. Useful for fresh eating, jelly, juice, or wine. Full Sun. Deciduous. |
| Flame | Early ripening red seedless grape. America's most popular supermarket grape. Mild sweet flavor. Good vigor and productivity. |
| Glenora | Vigorous, cold-hardy, seedless, blue-black grape with a sweet, spicy, and slightly fruity, blueberry-like flavor. Known for its thin skin, tender flesh, and high yields. Ripens early to mid-season. |
| Interlaken | A popular, early-ripening seedless, yellow-green grape known for a sweet, crisp, and tangy flavor. Highly productive and disease-resistant hybrid of Thompson seedless grape. Vigorous, self-fertile, and hardy. Great for fresh eating, raisins, or juice. |

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| <p>Black Monukka</p> | <p>A versatile, vigorous, and cold-hardy European seedless grape. Produces large, loose clusters of sweet, crisp, dark, thin-skinned berries, ideal for fresh eating, raisins, or wine. Self-fertile. Ripens in mid-fall. Full sun.</p> |
| <p>Reliance</p> | <p>Early maturing dark purple fruit is excellent for jams, jellies, and raisins. Mild, sweet, fruity flavor. Self-pollinating.</p> |
| <p>Valiant</p> | <p>Super cold-hardy, blue-skinned grape developed for northern climates. Produces small to medium, sweet, slipskin berries in late summer with a similar flavor to Concord. Excellent for jams, jellies, juice, and fresh eating.</p> |
| <p>Vanessa</p> | <p>Deep red medium size oval shaped seedless grapes. Early ripener. The flavor is mild and fruity, and berry texture is firm. The fruit quality is among the best of the red seedless types. Grows well even in the coldest zones, makes an excellent investment for frigid winters. USDA Zones 5-8.</p> |
| <p>Venus</p> | <p>Early-ripening, blue-black seedless grape known for it's sweet, "foxy" muscat flavor and thick skin. Forms tight, productive clusters ideal for fresh eating, juice, jelly, or wine.</p> |
