Strawberries

Many varieties exist that vary in flavor and season of harvest. There are two classes of strawberries, June-bearing and everbearing. June-bearing bear fruit once a season, usually late spring/early summer. They are often good for preserves and freezing due to the large quantity at one time. Everbearing bear fruit summer through fall, not all at one time, and are good for eating fresh.

The lists below represent what was ordered or grown for 2026. If you'd like to check on current availability of a particular variety, please check with a store associate.

Variety	Description
Albion	Everbearing. They have fruits which have a uniformly conical shape, bright red color, reliable firmness, and surprisingly sweet taste. Albion is a popular variety for home gardeners due to the bounty of red flavorful berries and its ease of care and growth.
Hood	June-bearing. They are one of the most popular Northwest varieties, they bear heavy crops of large, delectable, deep red berries. Sweet, firm, and delicious, Hood berries are great for fresh eating, preserves and freezing for mid-winter treats.
Mary's Peak	June-bearing. They have large fruits that ripens late and firm berries with excellent flavor. Upright plants are very productive. Good for fresh eating or processing.
Ozark	Everbearing. Hardy, and produces large, firm, and bright red berries with a sweet, juicy flavor. Self-pollinating and yields fruit from late spring through to the first frost. Great for fresh eating, freezing, and preserves.

Quinault	Everbearing. High-yielding, and produces large, soft, and very sweet red berries from late spring to mid-fall. Great for containers. Vigorous, self-pollinating, and resistant to common diseases. Great for fresh eating, jams, and desserts.
Royal Royce	Everbearing. High-yielding, producing very large, firm, and conical berries. Low runners and easier to manage. Vigorous and moderately disease-resistant.
Summer Breeze Cherry	Everbearing. Flavorful and ornamental, known for its striking, semi-double, deep pink-to-red flowers and sweet, medium-sized red fruit. Ideal for containers, hanging baskets, or borders, it grows 6-12 inches tall, produces few runners, and fruits from spring through fall.
Summer Breeze Rose	Everbearing. Flavorful and ornamental, prized for its intense, deep rose-pink, semi-double flowers and sweet, bright red, medium-sized fruits. Ideal for containers, hanging baskets, and small gardens with its compact size. Produces few runners and flowers from midsummer until frost.
Tillamook	High-yielding, midseason cultivar known for producing large, firm, and uniformly-shaped bright red berries. Developed by Oregon State University. Excellent, sweet flavor, and ideal for fresh eating, freezing, or baking.
