Viola spp.



Best in full sun during cooler months or partial shade in warmer months



Keep moist in well-draining soil, not waterlogged



Self-seeding Perennial, hardy in zones 3-8



The Cool-Season Star

Pansies & Violas are the quintessential cool-season plants, often the best choice for color throughout the fall, winter, and spring.

These cold-hardy plants can bloom all winter in zones 7 and higher, only petering out in the coldest of winter or hottest days of summer. Pansies and violas both have their strengths - pansies are known for their

showy large flowers, where violas have smaller, more abundant, and more resilient blooms.

- Long blooming season
- Flowers edible for humans and are pet-safe.
- Early nectar source for pollinators.
- Pansies are great for showy containers
- Violas are great for edging, mass planting, and hanging baskets.

Maintenance & Pruning

Deadheading spent blooms can help encourage more blooms and prolong the blooming period before they put their energy towards setting seeds. Pinching back or pruning leggy stems will promote a bushier habit and more blooms. Fertilize during active blooming season to boost growth.



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
